Jesus Is Lord: Colossians 2:6–7

GATHERING

Light a candle to remind yourselves that Jesus is present and that his loving lordship reaches every part of our lives.

PRAYER OF THE WEEK

Lord, you call us beyond words into a life shaped by your love. Bring our beliefs and our actions into harmony. Guide our relationships, habits, priorities, and values so that others may recognize your grace in us. Teach us to depend on you, submit to your way, and discover the joy and purpose of life under your lordship. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION - Take a few moments to check in with one another.

Highs & Lows

- What is one thing that brought you joy this week?
- Where do you need a fresh start?

THINKING ABOUT THE UPCOMING WEEK’S SCRIPTURE

So, live in Christ Jesus the Lord in the same way as you received him. — Colossians 2:6 (CEB)

The earliest Christians confessed three life-changing words: Jesus is Lord. This was more than a statement of belief. It meant trusting Jesus enough to let his teaching reshape the way they lived.

- What do you think it means to call Jesus ‘Lord’?
- Where is it easiest for your beliefs and actions to agree?
- What part of your life is hardest to place under Christ’s direction?
- How might a church or community change when Jesus is truly Lord?

DAILY BIBLE READINGS - As you read this week, ask: **What changes when Jesus is truly Lord of our lives?**

If your household includes children, feel free to use a children’s Bible or summarize the readings in simple language.

DEVOTIONAL

When the first Christians named what they believed, they offered three words: Jesus is Lord. Those words were simple, but they changed everything.

The disciples had already walked beside Jesus. They heard his teaching and witnessed his miracles, yet they were often confused, reactive, and afraid. After the resurrection, they understood that Jesus was more than a teacher or companion. He was Lord. As they surrendered themselves to him, fearful disciples became courageous witnesses.

Calling Jesus ‘Lord’ means more than being grateful that he saves us. It means trusting him to lead us. A lord is not someone whose advice we consider only when it is convenient. To confess Jesus as Lord is to let his way shape our relationships, habits, priorities, values, words, and decisions.

Tom Berlin suggests that two revealing questions about a life are: 1) What did this person believe? 2) How did this person live? Christian discipleship becomes compelling when those answers belong together—when our lives flow from the faith we profess.

This does not mean we become perfect overnight. Transformation grows as we remain rooted in Christ, depend on his grace, practice his teaching, and allow the Holy Spirit to direct us. Jesus is a loving Lord who welcomes prodigals home, forgives sin, and leads us toward a life richer than the one we could build alone.

What would happen if, wherever we went, we asked what it means for Jesus to be Lord in that moment? Our choices might change. Our relationships might heal. Our churches might become agents of grace, justice, and community transformation. When Jesus is truly Lord, belief becomes practice—and life is transformed.

PRAY TOGETHER

Invite each person to name one area of life they want to place more fully under Christ’s direction. Then pray together:

Lord, we confess that you are our Savior and our Lord. Forgive us when our actions do not reflect what we say we believe. Root us deeply in your love and shape us into people whose relationships, habits, priorities, and values look like yours. Transform our lives, our church, and our community through your grace. Amen.

MEALTIME PRAYER

Lord Jesus, thank you for this food and for everyone gathered here. May our life together reflect your love and may all we do honor you as Lord. Amen.

SERVICE CHALLENGE - *This is one way we share God’s love with the world.*

At the beginning of each day this week, pray: ‘Jesus, be Lord of my life today.’

Choose one relationship, habit, priority, or decision and ask how it might look different if it were fully shaped by Christ. Then take one faithful step.

CLOSING & BLESSING

Extinguish your candle as a reminder that Christ’s light continues to guide those who live under his loving lordship.

With permission, make the sign of the cross on one another’s hands or foreheads and say: **‘Jesus is Lord. Root your life in him, follow his way, and let his love transform you.’**
