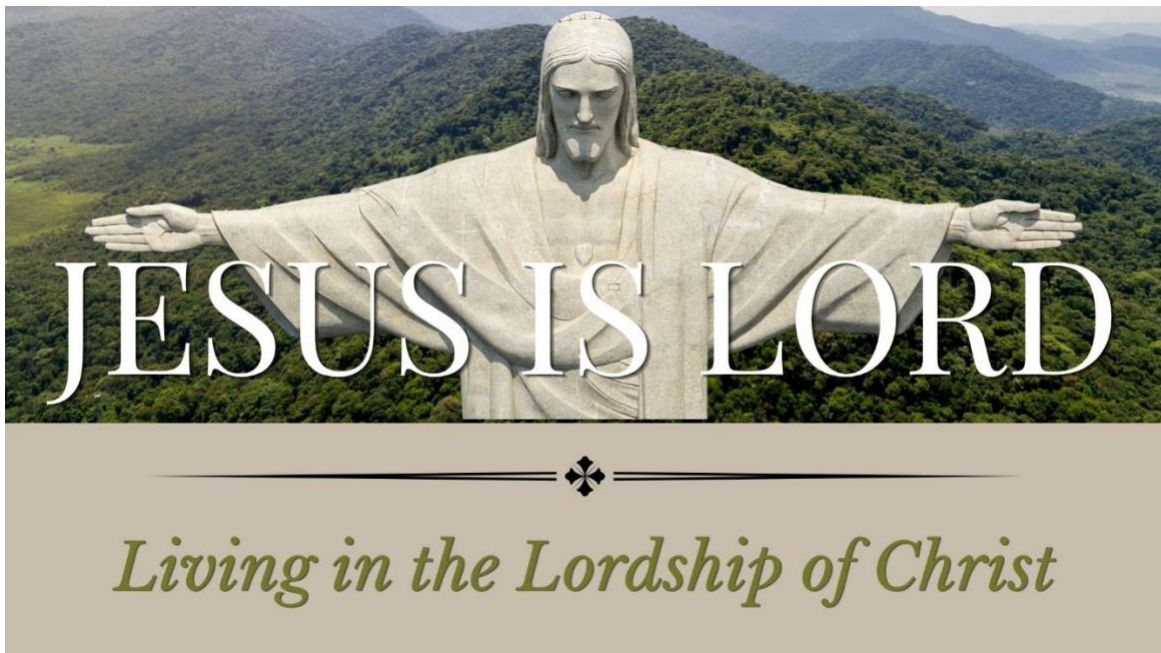

THIS WEEK'S "AT HOME" DEVOTIONAL

Compassion: Luke 7:11–17

GATHERING

Light a candle to remind yourselves that Jesus sees every person, draws near to those who suffer, and calls us to share his compassion.

PRAYER OF THE WEEK

Compassionate Lord, you see the pain we overlook and draw near to people others avoid. Open our eyes to notice those who are hurting. Soften our hearts when fear, anger, or judgment keeps us at a distance. Give us courage to listen, wisdom to respond, and love that moves us to action. Shape our lives by the compassion of Jesus Christ. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION - Take a few moments to check in with one another.

Highs & Lows

- What is one thing that brought you joy this week?
- When did someone’s compassion make a difference for you?

THINKING ABOUT THE UPCOMING WEEK’S SCRIPTURE

When he saw her, the Lord had compassion for her and said, “Don’t cry.” — Luke 7:13

At Nain, Jesus notices a grieving widow whose only son has died. He sees her sorrow and vulnerability, is moved with compassion, and acts. Jesus shows us that compassion begins with attention, moves toward suffering, and offers love through practical action.

- What do you notice about the way Jesus responds to the widow?
- Why is it sometimes easier to avoid another person’s pain?
- What is the difference between pity and compassion?
- Who might need you to see, listen, and move toward them this week?

DAILY BIBLE READINGS - As you read this week, ask: **How does the compassion of Jesus teach us to see, feel, and act?**

If your household includes children, feel free to use a children’s Bible or summarize the readings in simple language.

DEVOTIONAL

Faith is revealed not only by what we believe, but also by how we live. Calling Jesus ‘Lord’ means allowing his character to shape our conduct. Compassion is one of the clearest signs that Christ is forming us.

When Jesus enters Nain, he encounters a grieving woman who has lost her only son. As a widow, she may also have lost her security and support. Jesus sees more than a funeral procession. He sees her sorrow, vulnerability, and uncertain future. Jesus’ heart goes out to her. He does not move away from suffering or offer an easy explanation. He moves toward her, speaks with tenderness, touches the bier, and acts. In Jesus, compassion means seeing clearly, feeling another person’s pain, and offering what love can give.

Compassion is different from pity. Pity can keep a safe distance; compassion stands beside someone. It listens without judgment and asks what faithful help might look like. It may offer practical assistance, advocate for change, or simply stay when there is no quick solution.

Compassion can leave us weary, so it must remain rooted in Christ’s love. We honor our limits, receive strength through prayer and community, and trust God to do what we cannot. We may not solve every problem, but we can see the need, move closer, and let God’s love become visible through our actions.

PRAY TOGETHER

Invite each person to name someone who is hurting, overlooked, or in need of care. Then pray together:

Compassionate Jesus, thank you for seeing us and meeting us with mercy. Open our eyes to the people around us. Free us from judgment and indifference. Give us patient ears, gentle words, wise boundaries, and willing hands. Show us one faithful way to move toward another person’s need. Amen.

MEALTIME PRAYER

Compassionate God, thank you for this food and for everyone gathered here. As you have cared for us, teach us to notice those in need and share your love with generous hearts. Amen.

SERVICE CHALLENGE - ***This is one way we share God’s love with the world.***

Practice three movements of compassion this week: see the need, move toward the person, and share God’s love through action. Listen to someone who is hurting, offer practical help, write an encouraging note, or support a ministry serving vulnerable neighbors.

CLOSING & BLESSING

Extinguish your candle as a reminder that the light of Christ goes with you, helping you see suffering and respond with love.

With permission, make the sign of the cross on one another’s hands or foreheads and say: ***‘Go with the compassion of Christ. See the need, move toward your neighbor, and let God’s love become action.’***
